January 2023

There is no long lead-time legislation to report this month.






Data Transfers to South Korea

The UK government has announced that data protection law in the Republic of Korea offers sufficient levels of protection to allow transfers of personal data to organisations in South Korea. Personal data transfers from the UK to South Korea will no longer need to rely on the use of additional safeguards such as Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs) or Binding Corporate Rules (BCRs).

Ultra Low Emission Zone to be Expanded across London

The Mayor of London has announced that the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) will be expanded to cover the whole of London from Tuesday 29 August 2023. Currently only areas within the North and South Circular Roads are covered by the ULEZ. The expansion of the ULEZ will require all vehicles in London that do not meet the relevant emissions standard to pay a daily charge of £12.50.

Disabled Workers and Workers with Long-Term Health Conditions

The Health and Safety Executive has published new [guidance](#) to ensure that disabled people and those with long-term health conditions get more support from employers to help them succeed in the workplace. The new guidance outlines steps employers should take to support disabled workers and those with long-term health conditions through:

- creating a supportive and enabling workplace;
- taking an inclusive approach to workplace health;
- understanding the work barriers that impact on workers;
- making suitable workplace adjustments or modifications;
- developing skills, knowledge and understanding; and
- using effective and accessible communication.
