

Legislation Outlook

June 2023

Upcoming Standard-Related Legislation

ISO 14001

Packaging Waste (Data Reporting) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2023

These <u>Regulations</u> come into effect on 30 June 2023 to correct errors and omissions in the <u>Packaging Waste</u> (<u>Data Reporting</u>) (<u>Scotland</u>) <u>Regulations 2023</u> ('the original Regulations'), which came into force at the end of February. Similar legislation for England, Wales and Northern Ireland is expected to be published shortly. The changes include:

- providing clarity to the industry regarding producers' reporting obligations;
- ensuring producers submit all the information required for calculating their 2024 obligations;
- removing some potential loopholes in the original Regulations; and
- ensuring the reporting requirements are fully aligned with the digital system that producers will use to report their data.

There should not be any significant inconvenience to affected organisations, particularly in relation to new reporting requirements - the changes have been drafted to ensure that the new reporting obligations only relate to data that is already required to be collected, either under the original Regulations or under the <u>Producer Responsibility Obligations (Packaging Waste) Regulations 2007</u>.

ISO 45001

Railways and Other Guided Transport Systems (Safety) (Amendment) Regulations 2023

These <u>Regulations</u> come into force on 30 June 2023 and amend the <u>Railways and Other Guided Transport</u> <u>Systems (Safety) Regulations 2006</u> to end the recognition of EU certificates issued to entities in charge of maintenance ('ECMs') of domestic freight wagons in Great Britain. From 30 June, ECMs assigned to freight wagons used in domestic traffic in Great Britain will need to be certified by a UK certification body.

Two related amendments are also made to the 2006 Regulations:

- ECM certification bodies will no longer need to follow the EU sectoral accreditation scheme; and
- UK ECMs will no longer need to obtain two separate ECM certificates when maintaining both domestic and international vehicles.

Remember: short notice changes to legislation are not reported in this briefing; all changes are delivered direct into your Activ Comply system as they come into effect.

Retained EU Law

Following the <u>Retained EU Law (Revocation and Reform) Bill</u>'s defeat in the House of Lords, the Government has amended the to scrap the proposed sunset clause from the Bill, which would have automatically revoked most retained EU law at the end of 2023. Around 5,000 items of EU law have so far been identified by the Government.

Instead, the Government has published a list of nearly 600 items of retained EU law that will be revoked at the end of the year. The list largely includes legislation that is no longer relevant post-Brexit but does include a significant amount of environmental legislation relating to fisheries and biocidal products. The Bill is still undergoing amendment, we will provide further analysis once the Bill is finalised.

Guidance

ICO Publishes New SAR Guidance for Employers

New <u>guidance</u> to help employers deal with Subject Access Requests ('SARs') has been published by the Information Commissioner's Office.

Following receipt of an SAR from an individual, an employer is required to provide details of the individual's personal information that they hold (including where they got their information from, what they are using it for and who they are sharing it with). Employers have one month to deal with the request, although an additional two months are permitted if the request is complex.

The ICO received over 15,000 complaints related to SARs in the twelve months leading up to March this year, and regularly takes enforcement action against organisations that fail to deal with SARs.

Consultations

High Risk Buildings

The Health and Safety Executive, in its role as the Building Safety Regulator, has published two consultations in relation to high-risk buildings (buildings at least 18 metres in height or at least 7 storeys with at least two residential units):

- a <u>consultation</u> seeking views on its information document that highlights the necessary competency for those managing high-risk buildings; and
- a <u>consultation</u> seeking views on its information document that highlights the necessary competency for the new principal designer and principal contractor roles.

Both consultations close on 16 June.

Nitrous Oxide

The Home Office has launched a <u>consultation</u> to obtain details of legitimate uses of nitrous oxide from organisations that manufacture, sell or use nitrous oxide as part of their business. The Government is proposing to control nitrous oxide as a Class C drug under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 but does not want to restrict its use for legitimate purposes.

This consultation closes on 27 June 2023.

Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCBs) Regulations

The Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs and the Welsh Government have launched a <u>consultation</u> seeking views on a small number of proposed changes to the Environmental Protection (Polychlorinated Biphenyls and other Dangerous Substances) (England and Wales) Regulations 2000, including a clarification of the requirement to remove PCB-containing equipment by the end of December 2025.

This consultation closes on 30 June 2023.
